Minutes of October 5, 2023

- 1. Fr. Mark opened the meeting with a prayer at 9:39 am.
- 2. Ginny Grant requested a motion to accept the minutes of the September 7, 2023, meeting. Minutes had been approved by email vote.

3. **FINANCE**—Offertory collections remain constant. At Masses on October 14 and 15, the Finance Committee will present to the Parish the complete Financial statement of our Parish, as well as the vision for the future. It was requested that Council members bring feedback from parishioners to the November meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

- No additional comments on September reports.
- The election of new council members will be held on December 9 and 10. Announcement will appear in the bulletin for 11/18-19 and 11/25-26.
 Forms/announcement used last year will be updated with this year's information.
 Fr. needs help in distributing pencils throughout the Church for completing the ballot. Pencils to be collected following the 11:00 am Mass on Sunday. It was suggested that applicants limit the wording for reasons to apply. Pictures will again be on the board in the gathering space announcing the candidates.
- Charles McShane presented the 3rd draft of the Annual Summary. It was determined that information presented would be for the calendar year. Summary to be published in January for prior 12 months period. It was suggested that the Parish Life Activities section be expanded to include such things as Veterans Dinner, St. Patrick's Day Dinner, St. John's Retreat, Ladies Tea, and the various activities of the Spanish community.
- Update on AED units. Still working on obtaining them. Cost approved previously.
- St. John's Retreat had 63 men participate. Bishop Luis celebrated the closing Mass. The next retreat will be held on March 1, 2024. Thanked us for our prayers.

NEW BUSINESS:

- The top seven choices for the stained-glass windows in the McGivney Center will be announced in the bulletin on October 7-8. The top vote getter was "Jesus Blesses the Children".
- A bus has been secured for the Eucharistic Congress on October 21. Room for 56. Registered participants will have first priority to seating. Bus to leave at 6:30 am for Raleigh and leave Raleigh at 6:30 pm. Cost to be assumed by the parish.
- Charles McShane did some research on Paying for Senior Care. There are many cites available. Most looking to have a link to their service in our bulletin. Questions arose as to our liability. Charles will draft a report on his findings which Fr. Mark will submit to the Diocese for their input.

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, November 2, following the 9:00 am Mass.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:13 am. Fr. Mark offered a prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary to aid the Council in their work.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS REPORT

Existing Projects Status

- Annual high dusting and window cleaning in church completed.
- Sidewalks pressure washed.
- Church exterior pressure washed.
- Broken baptismal Font removed (baptismal font, electrical and plumbing demoed, new concrete poured, floor outlet installed, temporary carpet installed) and a portable one put in its place.
- New janitorial service provider hired with commercial/church cleaning expertise necessary to meet the expanding needs/usage of our facilities. The contractor (JanPro of Wilmington) was obtained through a competitive bid process.
- A new 7.5-ton air conditioning unit was installed. This unit serves a portion of the parish hall and replaces a broken unit that has not worked since February 2022.
- Security crash bars were installed on the perimeter doors to the bell tower. These doors can which were previously open 24/7 can now be locked.
- There was a pipe break for the main water line feeding the McGivney Center which required an emergency repair. The cause of the leak was a failed connection joint.
- Refrigerant leaks were identified in the air-conditioning unit that serves the McGivney center. These were repaired and the system was returned to normal operation.
- Our existing HVAC contractor was shortcutting PM's and became nonresponsive for repair activities and was replaced with a new service and installation contractor (Superior Mechanical).
- Four cracked pews in the church were repaired and two pews that were removed to accommodate equipment access for lighting and sprinkler repairs in April, have been reinstalled.

Looking Ahead

- Beginning work on a Reserve Study of the Parish's assets to assist in budgeting for repairs and replacements.
- Working with the St. Michael's Ministry on physical plant upgrades and modifications to enhance safety and security.
 - Adding CCTV cameras around the site and in the buildings to help monitor events.
 - Exploring options for electronic locks and card readers for building access.
 - Exploring options for rekeying the buildings to better control access (too many keys in circulation).

• Creating inventories of assets for insurance purposes as well as tagging/marking assets for identification.

- > Music Judy Snopek

- > Choir Sandy Gemach
