# ST. BRENDAN PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETNG MINUTES OF JANUARY 4, 2024

**ATTENDEES:** Fr. Mark, Kimberly Antolini, Stephen Bonawitz, Madeline Dubas, Sandy Esparza, Ginny Grant, Fr. - 1. Fr. Mark opened the meeting at 9:35 am with a prayer.
- 2. Newly elected members of the Pastoral Council were introduced and welcomed. They are: Kimberly Antolini, Stephen Bonawitz, Celeste Korpon, Vincent Russo.
- **3**. Due to the incorporation of St. Brendan the Navigator Catholic Parish of Shallotte, Fr. requested that the 2023 officers (Ginny Grant, Chair, Charles McShane, Vice Chair, Madeline Dubas, Secretary) be retained for 2024. Council approved.
- 4. **FINANCE--**The December collection was approximately \$185,000. The new rectory has been purchased and should be completed by March/April. It is located in The Sanctuary, Sunset Beach, approximately 6.7 miles from the Church. Approximately 2,300 sq. ft., it will have 4 bedrooms, 3 baths and a 2-1/2 car garage. Property does have a POA, however, it is reasonable. Purchase price will be offset by the sale of the existing rectory which is currently being assessed to determine if upgrades to existing building would increase the sale value.
- **4a**. The Finance Council has placed a hold on the purchase of the three AED units previously approved for purchase. Additional research as to vendor, cost of approximately \$1,500, need for certification and training, as well as maintenance requirements is being performed by Peg Dotson and should be complete by the end of January.
- **5**. The Minutes of the December 7, 2023, meeting were approved. It was noted that meeting minutes will be distributed by email to all members prior to the next meeting. Any additions or corrections to be made should be reported to the Secretary for correction prior to the next meeting. Due to time constraints, only the approval of the minutes will be on the agenda.
- **6. ST. MICHAEL MINISTRY**—Report attached. The issue of locking church doors during mass and other events was again revisited. Father Mark approved a second safety evaluation by the Sheriff's Department.
- **7. BUILDING AND GROUNDS**—Report attached. Meeting today with Matt Kelly. In-house reserve study is ongoing.
- **8. KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS**—Report attached. 24 coats were donated to Waccamaw school. Goal for next year is 50 to 100 with more schools participating.
- 9. COLUMBIETTES—Report attached. Condition of Mary's garden was discussed.
- **10. FAITH FORMATION**—Report attached.
- 11. LITURGY—Next meeting being held on January 10. Revert to Ordinary Time on January 9. Father Anit to announce starting on January 5, that parishioners should take the flowers from the altar. Question raised as to feasibility of providing envelopes to defray cost of flowers for major holidays.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**—

- A total of 892 ballots were submitted, of which 49 were turned in blank. Reasons offered included not knowing the identity of the nominees. Suggestion made to appoint a three-person election committee for next year's election and to provide photographs prior to the election. Tabled until September.
- Parish Community Annual Summary is almost complete. Waiting for additional population information from Knights and Columbiettes. Bulletin announcement attached.
- Cape Fear Life Care/Hospice and Palliative Care—Report attached. First meeting with parishioners to be held on March 19 following the 9:00 am Mass. This will be a 45 minute program to be held in the parish hall. Charlie McShane will emcee along with Kathleen Brandenburg, Human Life & Dignity. CFLC has confirmed that they follow the church doctrine regarding assisted suicide.
- No discussion on Our Lady of Guadalupe celebration due to absence of Ada Flores.
- Father Anit thanked everyone for his birthday celebration.
- AED Update—previously reported.
- Artist's proofs of new chapel windows are being prepared for approval prior to building.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**—

- Fr. Anit discussed the possibility of holding Stations of the Cross on the beach which was met favorably by the Council. Additional information is required. Fr. Anit will be away from January 14 to February 13. Possible date would be March 1.
- Due to time restraints, all other new business was tabled until the February meeting.

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, February 1, following the 9:00 am Mass.

Meeting adjourned at 10:50am with Fr. Mark offering the closing prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary to aid the Council in their work.
