# ST. BRENDAN PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES OF APRIL 11, 2024 MEETING

1. Father Mark opened the meeting with a prayer at 9:37 am.

2. Minutes of the March 7, 2024, meeting which had been previously emailed to all members were approved.

3. **FINANCE** -- reported Parish finances are holding steady. Easter underscored need for additional parking especially in light of all new construction in our area. New rectory scheduled for inspection on May 6, Fathers will have orientation of new building on May 7 following report. Settlement scheduled for May 14. Final bills have not yet been received. All bills must be approved by the Diocese before payment. Estimated that move into new rectory will take place in June. Complete report will be distributed to the entire parish in June. Old rectory is under contract waiting approval by the Diocese. Funds received from sale of old rectory will reduce cost of new rectory. Even though we are now incorporated and "own" all buildings and properties, we are still required to submit bills to the Diocese. On April 25, meeting will be held to develop preliminary budget for next year. No new big expenditures—baby steps only.

## 4. REVIEW OF PASTORAL PLAN 2023-2024 FOR 2024-2025

a. Form has been developed by Matt Kelly and Kim Antolini which will give detailed information on each ministry within the Parish.

- Determine best usage of facility space by determining number of each group/meeting.
- Reason for ministry and is it still viable.
- Add in establishing an online calendar within our website that groups could utilize to determine available meeting space.
- Will connect to annual Parish Ministry Summary report.
- Off site meetings could also be shown in calendar.

- c. Develop a Vocations Committee to foster vocations. Currently have four seminarians.

d. Fundraising efforts are reported quarterly and annually.
