ST. BRENDAN PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES OF May 2, 2024, MEETING

1. Fr. Mark opened the meeting with a prayer at 9:33 am.

2. Minutes of April 11, 2024, meeting which had been previously emailed to all members were approved.

3. FINANCE: The question was raised, "How are Finance Council members elected?" Father Mark explained that according to Diocesan Guidelines for Parish Finance Councils, all members are appointed by the pastor for a term of 2-4 years (as opposed to Pastoral Councils, in which ³/₄ are elected by parishioners and ¹/₄ are appointed). As such, effective with the end of the fiscal year (30 June), Jack Semanko will end 14 years of dedicated service to the Parish on Finance Council and as Chair. Joe Butler also will end 8 years of dedicated service to the Parish on Finance Council, both having generously gone well beyond the usual 2 to 4-year terms associated with Finance Councils. Father introduced Lucille Nazzario, who will be the new PFC Chair effective 1 July. He cited that this is the opportune time for a changeover of this magnitude: the fiscal year has ended, the new budget has been developed, the office building has been completed, the purchase of the new rectory will have been finalized, the sale of the former rectory will be finalized, and the old office building has been renovated to accommodate our Loaves and Fishes Pantry.

The Finance Council is comprised of five members appointed by the Pastor. The Diocesan Guidelines for Parish Finance Councils will be posted on our parish website similar to that of the Pastoral Council. Quarterly reports will be posted. While the Diocese only requires annual reports to be published, St. Brendan publishes them quarterly. Copies are available in the Gathering Space. Fr. Mark has appointed the additional members who will be trained by the Diocese for a 1 July start date.

Fr. Mark indicated the third quarter went very well. Copies are now available in the Gathering Space. The question of falling weekly contributions was raised. Father corrected that statement by noting that since the Finance Council made their presentation for increased donations in October of 2023, the contributions have increased by about \$4,400 per week. The presentation was written by Jack Semanko and was very well received by the parishioners with positive results.

4. THE PARISH PASTORAL PLAN FOR 2024-2025, as updated, was approved for submission to the Diocese for their approval. It will be posted to the website upon approval. The "tool" created to gather information on our various ministries has been placed on hold. Following discussions between Kim Antolini, Matt Kelly, our webmaster and IT from the Diocese, it was determined that this tool had more potential uses than originally thought. More research needs to be done before it can proceed.

5. OLD BUSINESS:

- Lower Cape Fear Life will be here on 27 June to assist parishioners with wills and various powers of attorney documents. Announcements will be published in the bulletin the four weeks prior to the event with Fr. Mark announcing it on Saturday/Sunday 22-23 June. Special attention will be given to new Out of State parishioners who may need to update their documents to North Carolina laws. A blurb could also be placed on the first page of the website.
- AED's have been purchased, received and installed. (One in the Gathering Space above the fire extinguisher.)

- The new rectory is on schedule with move-in prior to July 1. Joe Butler should be commended for the outstanding job he did negotiating the sales contract, as well as arranging for "extras" to be added at no charge.
- Father John Paul, our new Parochial Vicar, is scheduled to begin ministry at St. Brendan on 25 June. He is to be introduced and preach on the weekend of June 29-30.

6. NEW BUSINESS: PASTOR'S REPORT:

- It should be noted that supply chain issues were the only cause of delayed construction start of the McGivney Center, but building materials were stockpiled during the delay. Therefore, once construction did start, the building was completed only one month past the original "delivery" date. Original timeline: September '21-September '22. Actual timeline: February '22-Oct '22.
- In June 2023, Fr. Anit joined St. Brendan's as Associate Pastor.
- Father John Paul, our new Associate Pastor will arrive on 25 June 2024, and preach the weekend of June 29/30.
- St. Brendan's now has a parish vehicle for use by Fr. John Paul, eliminating mileage expenses.
- With addition of third priest, Diocesan guidelines required a new rectory. Necessary to acquire or build to a Diocesan specification of a bedroom/bath/sitting room for each priest plus a guest bedroom/bathroom.
- Based on current income and expenses plus future expansion income, determination was made by the Pastor, Finance Council, and the Diocesan Office of Business and Fiscal Services that we could secure up to an additional \$700,000 on our current loan to acquire a new rectory without placing undue financial hardship parishioners. This loan is secured by the Diocese and has been rolled into our existing office building loan. The 15-year term remains in effect. Jack Semanko and Joe Butler, as negotiators, did an excellent job in bringing this purchase to well under \$700,000 furnished and moved in. The new rectory is 4 bedrooms, 3 full baths.
- The sale of the existing rectory is independent of the office building/new rectory loan. Proceeds from this sale will be used for expansion of the parking lot. A total of 51 new spaces will be constructed on the soccer field.
- The new Easter Schedule for 2025 has been suggested as: 7:00 am, 8:30 am, 10:30 am, and *12:30 Spanish*.
